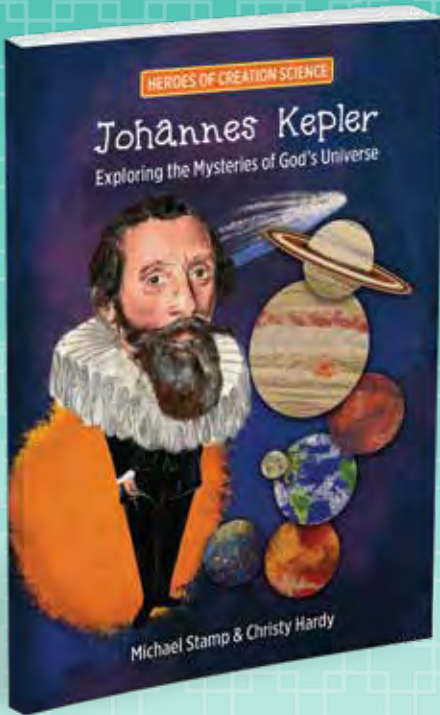

Good Creation & the Fall

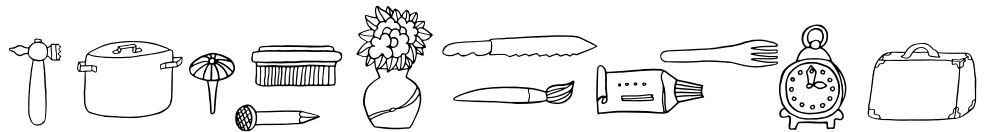

The Flood & Fossils

About 4,500 years ago, violence filled the earth. So God sent a flood to cover the whole planet. Before that, God told Noah to build a huge boat called an ark, and Noah obeyed Him. When the Flood came, Noah and his family got on board the Ark. At least two of each kind of land animal and bird did, too.

The Flood's waves were full of sand and mud that buried plants and animals to form fossils. The layers of sand and mud then hardened into rock. Scientists study these rock layers to find fossils and discover clues to Earth's history.

- ✓ Evidence for the Genesis Flood is all over the earth! We especially see the clues when we find many types of fossils on every continent, including Antarctica.
- ✓ The Ark saved Noah, his family, and bird and land animal kinds.
- ✓ Jesus is like the Ark—He rescues all people who trust in Him!

Press the dinosaur and seashell—or other items—into each cookie.



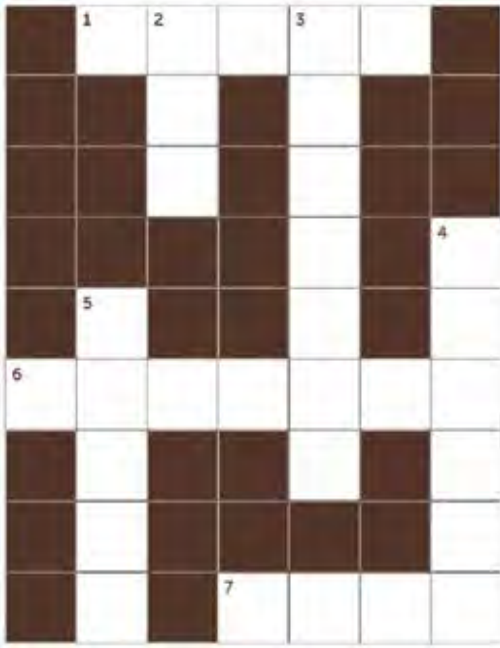
Bake the pressed cookies.

Coal is a fossil fuel made from plants that were buried during the Flood.



When you go outside and walk around, you're probably walking on ground laid down by the Flood.

Scientists sometimes dig in dirt or rock to look for fossils. Plants and animals must be buried quickly and deeply to become fossils.

Fossils rarely form today. If an animal dies today, it will decay or be eaten by other critters.

Fossils are found all over the world because the whole world was flooded. There are even fossils on Mount Everest—the tallest mountain in the world!

Fossils don't show evolution. There aren't any "in between" fossils. Except for small variations, creatures have basically stayed the same over time. Each fossil creature shows up with all its parts, according to its own kind, just as God made it.

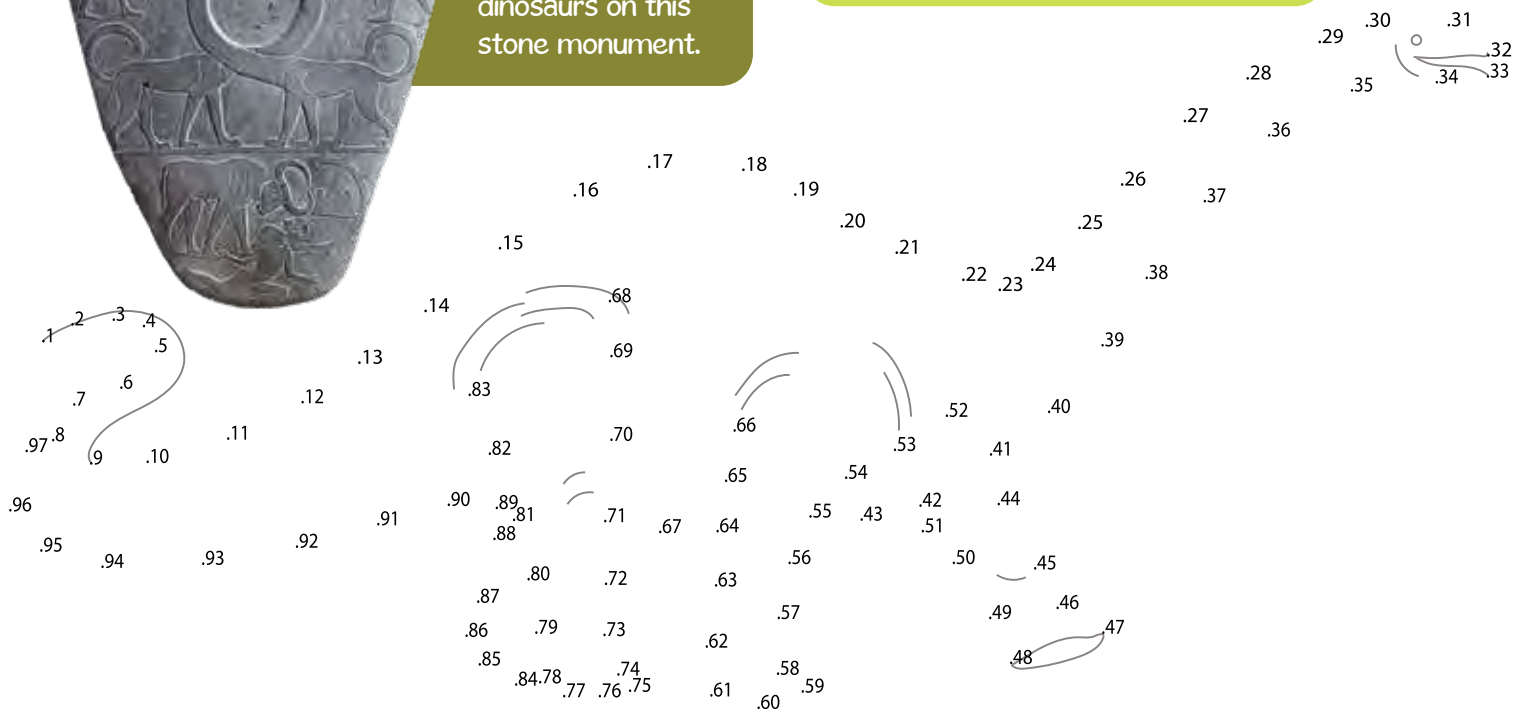
- ✓ Dinosaurs were created on Day 6 of the creation week.
- ✓ The Flood killed most dinosaurs, and many became fossils.
- ✓ Dinosaurs were on the Ark, and their descendants roamed the earth for many years after the Flood.
- ✓ For centuries, people all over the world reported seeing dragons. They even made dragon carvings and paintings.



About 4,000 years ago, Egyptians carved a pair of what look like long-necked sauropod dinosaurs on this stone monument.

Kinds & Cats

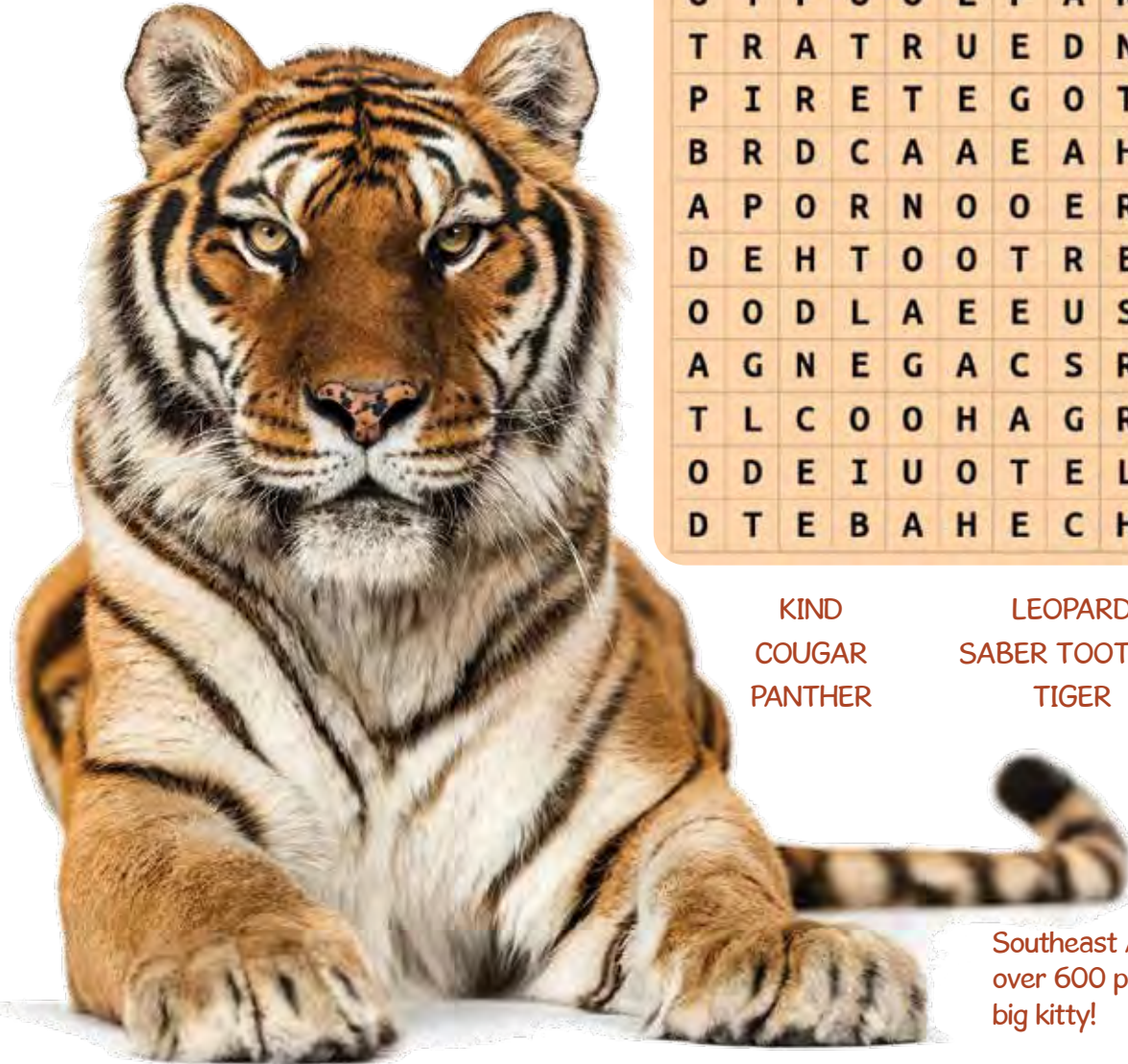

An ugly duckling?

Putting animals into categories is usually a simple task for biologists. But the platypus baffles them. It has fur like a mammal, lays eggs like a reptile, and has a bill like a duck. The platypus has spurs like a rooster and a tail like a beaver. How would you categorize the platypus? Is it a bird, a reptile, or a mammal? Or would you make a new category just for this one creature? This unique mammal shows God's creativity.

What's the difference between a kangaroo and a wallaby?

They are both marsupials, bounce as they run, and live in Australia. The biggest difference is their size. At over six feet tall, a normal kangaroo is about twice as tall and weighs three times as much as a typical wallaby. A kangaroo's legs are designed for moving fast. The wallaby has more compact legs. The kangaroo is usually reddish brown or gray, while his little cousin has a glossier coat that can be red, gray, brown, black, or white.

Horses, of Courses



Horses display our Creator's amazing design. These hoofed mammals can run fast to escape predators. They have excellent balance. They can even sleep standing up!

Horses can live more than 30 years. There are over 300 horse breeds in the world. For 4,000-plus years, horses were the fastest way to travel over land—they can run more than 30 miles per hour. Did you also know...

- ✓ Horses are really smart.
- ✓ They can see, smell, and hear very well.
- ✓ Like the cat kind, horse varieties are found all over the world.

Przewalski's (pronounced sheh-VAHL-skees) horses are from central Asia. They are a unique type of wild horse.

CRAFT TIME: Make your own hobby horse!



You will need: 1 sock, buttons, felt, bandana, yarn, twine or cord, scissors, hot glue gun, and a dowel rod



Stuff the sock with the batting.



Cut circles out of the felt for nostrils. Also cut triangles for ears.



Have an adult help you glue the felt nostrils, ears, and eye buttons in place.



Wrap a bunch of yarn around a piece of cardboard.



Glue a strip of felt to one end of the yarn bundle.



Cut the other end of the twine across the bottom and remove the cardboard.

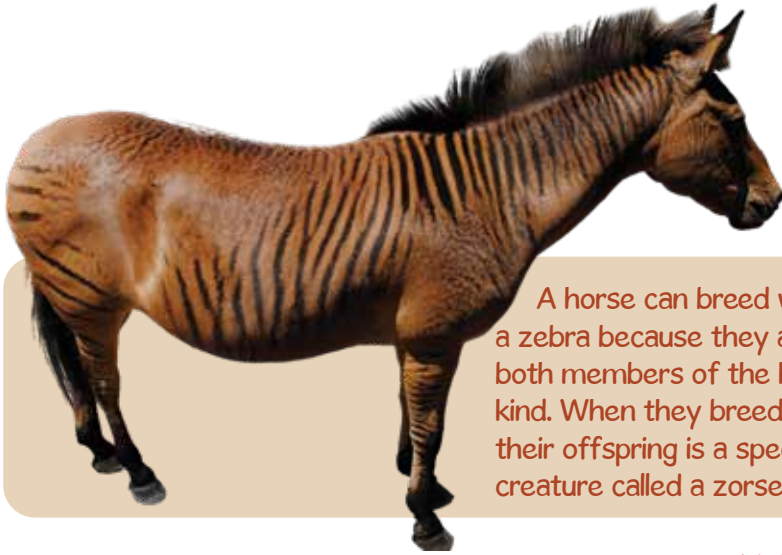
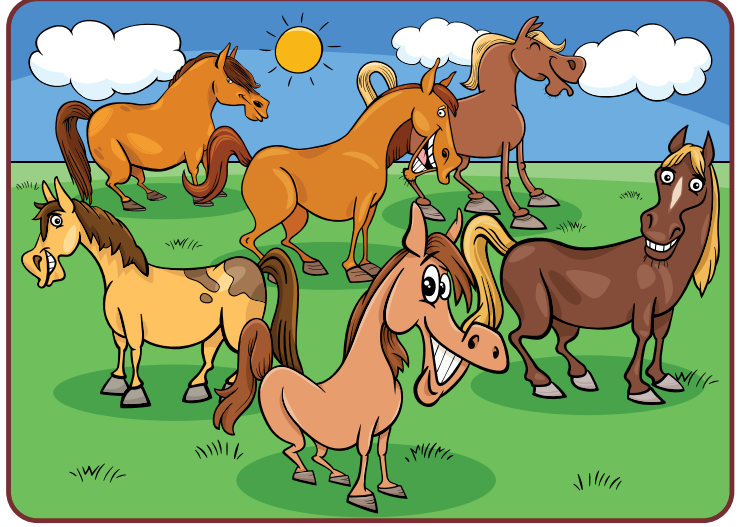
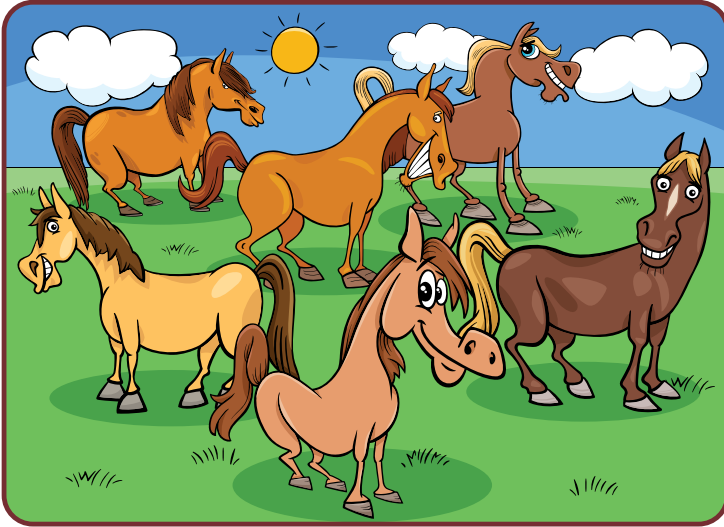


Glue the felt strip and yarn mane to the back of the horse head.

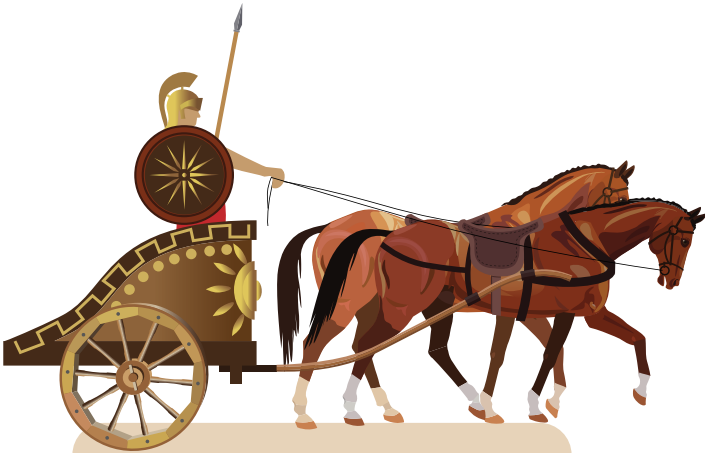

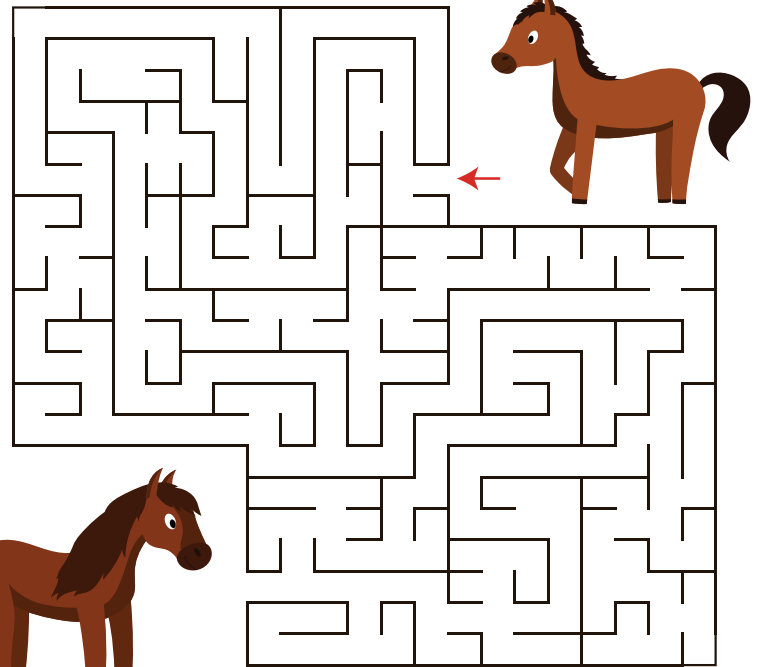

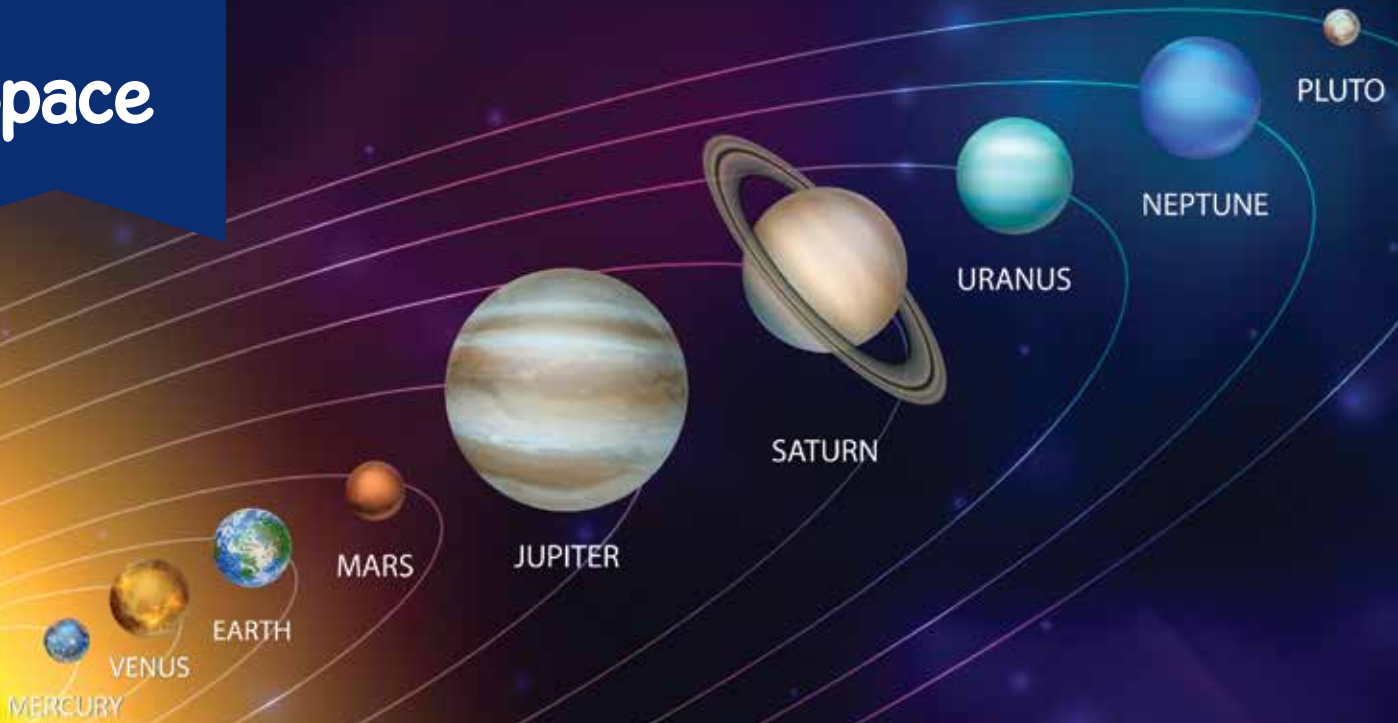

Space



Christ Jesus created the universe in only six days about 6,000 years ago. On Day 4 of the creation week, He made the sun, moon, stars, and planets.

Our earth and seven other planets orbit the sun; they circle the sun all the time. Together, the sun and planets are called the solar system. They display design, order, and balance because our Creator made them that way.

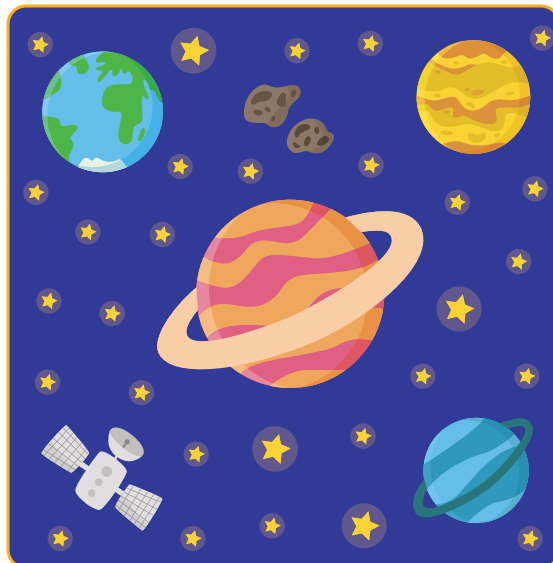
- ✓ Mercury, Venus, Earth, and Mars, the first four planets, are smaller than the others. They are hard and rocky.
- ✓ Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune are called gas giants because they're huge and made up of gases.
- ✓ Pluto, the farthest from the sun, stopped being an official planet in 2006. It's now called a dwarf planet.
- ✓ Asteroids and comets also orbit the sun. They're all part of our wonderful solar system!

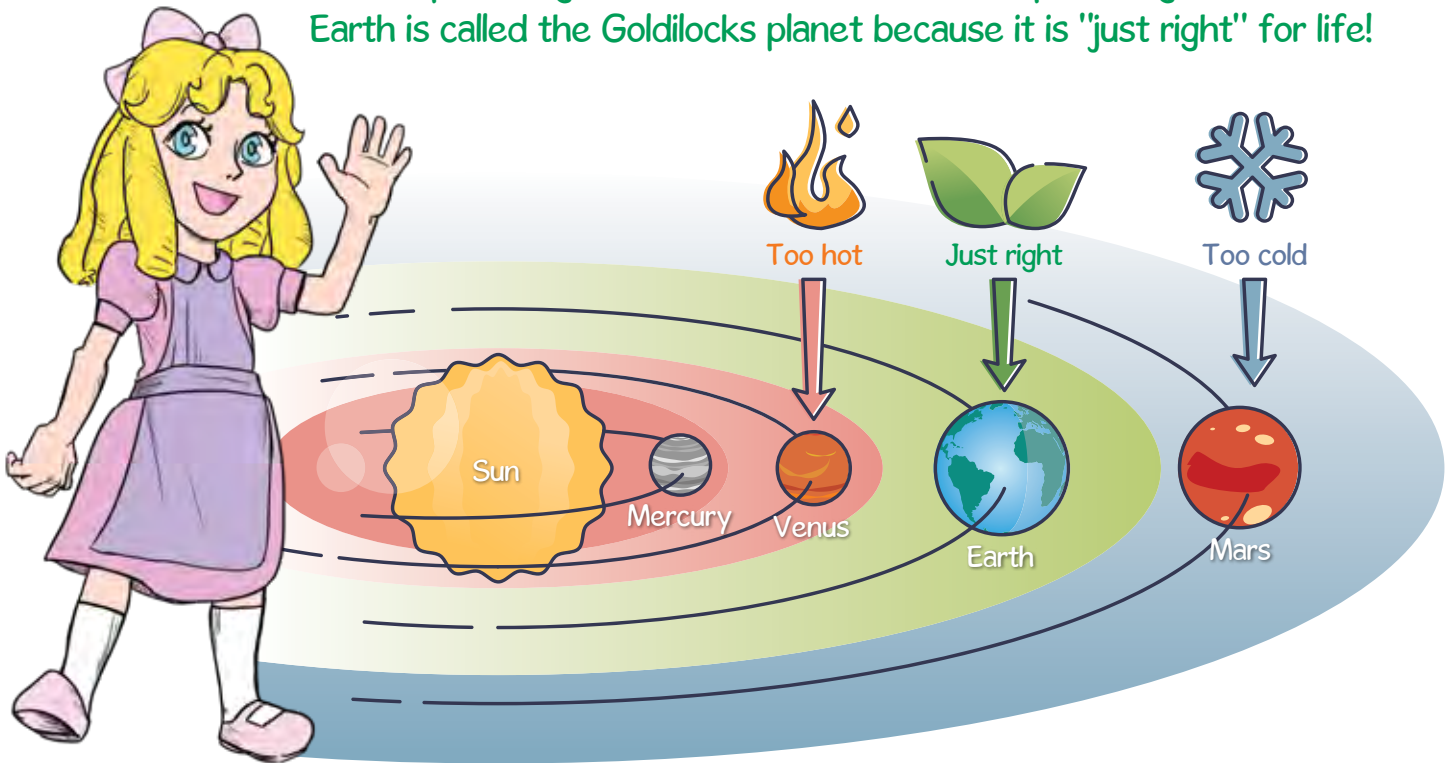
Goldilocks Planet

The creation declares the glory of the Lord Jesus, including Earth's design. We see His power in making the earth from nothing. We see His wisdom in putting Earth in the right place in our galaxy. We see His provision in giving Earth a perfect overall temperature, along with everything else needed for life here.



- ✓ Earth is called the Goldilocks planet because its temperature, distance from the sun, and size are "just right" for life to flourish.
- ✓ The tilt of Earth's axis at 23.5 degrees means the sun's heat hits the earth just right. The moon's gravitational pull makes sure the tilt stays stable.
- ✓ Earth's atmosphere maintains the temperature range needed for life. That's why Earth isn't too hot or too cold for us to survive.
- ✓ The winds and water on Earth help keep the temperature just right too!

Some planets get too hot for life, and some planets get too cold. Earth is called the Goldilocks planet because it is "just right" for life!



Paper Maché Globe Craft

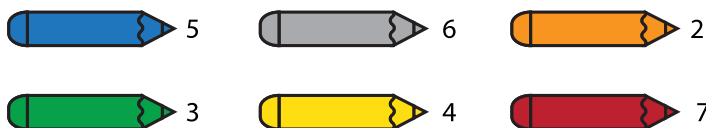
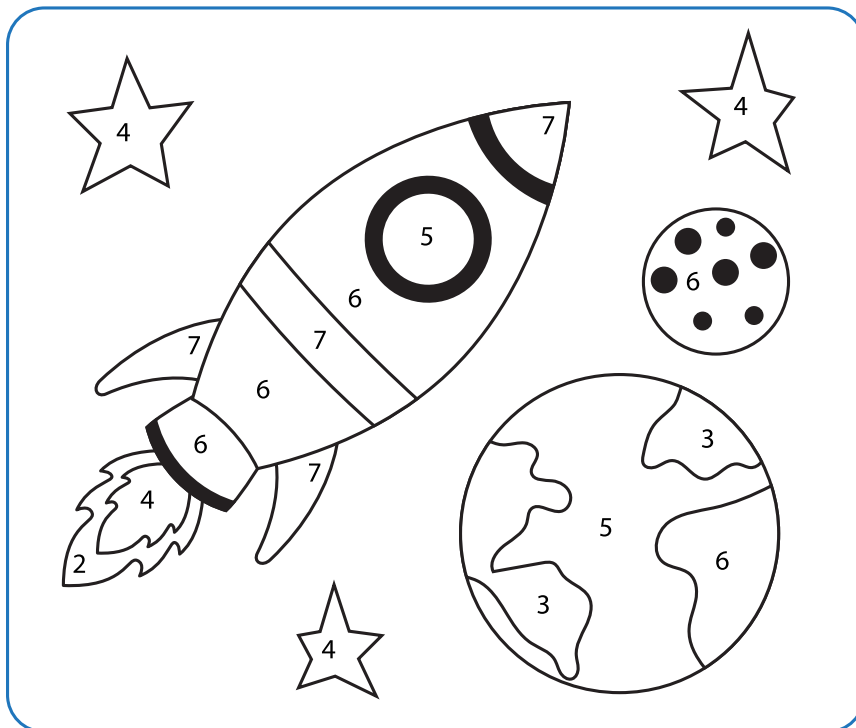
Materials needed: newspaper (torn in strips), 1 cup flour, 2 cups water, 1 tsp. salt, 1 whisk, 1 bowl, 1 balloon or bunch of plastic bags, black marker, and white, blue, and green acrylic paints.

Directions:

1. Mix the flour, water, and salt in a bowl with a whisk.
2. Dip individual strips of newspaper into the mixture, wiping off the excess with your fingers.
3. Apply the strips of wet newspaper randomly onto the bunch of plastic bags or balloon, overlapping and smoothing over each one so that it lies flat. Cover the entire shape, smoothing as you go.
4. Put the globe on top of a small bowl for a day or two so it can dry.
5. Once dry, paint the globe with white acrylic paint and let it dry. Draw the outline of the 7 continents onto the globe. Paint each continent green and the water blue.

Weather

Earth can have wild weather—lightning, hail, tornadoes, hurricanes, thunderstorms, heatwaves, and blizzards. Many extreme conditions can be monitored and forecast by scientists called meteorologists, who study weather. In the middle of a storm, stay calm and follow safety tips.

- ✓ Lightning is a bright flash of electricity during a storm. Thunder is the sound of air collapsing.
- ✓ When powerful, upward-moving winds freeze water in midair, it falls to the ground as icy chunks called hail. Most hailstones are tiny, but some can grow to the size of a softball or larger!
- ✓ Snowflakes form when tiny water droplets freeze and stick together. Air temperature and humidity determine a snowflake's shape. Most likely, no two snowflakes are exactly the same.



Hurricane Katrina is shown off the Gulf Coast of the United States in 2005. Hurricanes are large, swirling storms with powerful winds. They can flood and damage cities and countryside. A hurricane's calmest part is its "eye" near the center.

Are Humans and Chimps Related?

- ✓ Some people say humans and apes are closely related, but there are huge differences between us and all animals—including apes.
- ✓ Humans speak, but apes do not. Our brains, throat, vocal cords, and lungs are designed to work together for speech and even singing.
- ✓ Jesus built humans for walking and running, but apes are built for climbing. When apes walk, they prefer to walk on their knuckles.
- ✓ Look at a chimp's feet—it has hands for feet!
- ✓ Humans are made to walk upright. Our heads are right on top of our spines. Chimps are bent over. They were made to climb trees and swing from limbs.
- ✓ Jesus gave us hands that do precise things like write, draw, and play musical instruments. Our Creator is amazing!

God's once "very good" creation has been cursed by sin. People fight with each other, and so do many animals. All creatures eventually die.

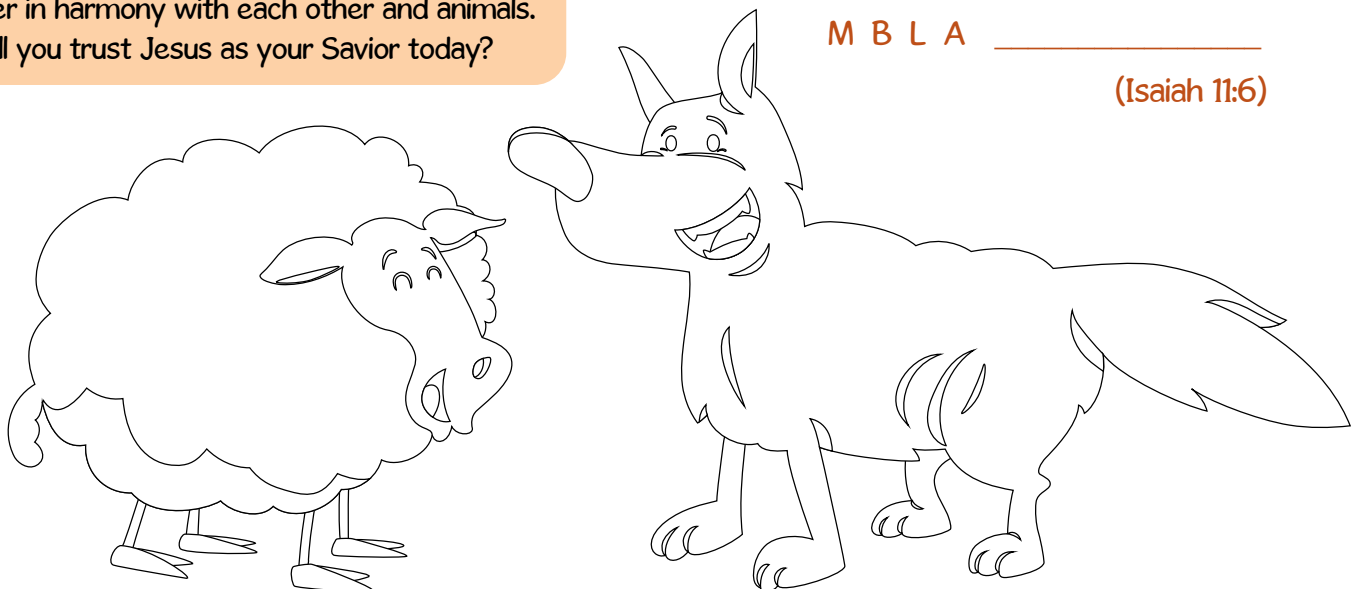
